# Principal's Message



Dear Parents and Friends,

During the first semester, students have been introduced to many new concepts and strategies. A lot of learning has taken place and teachers have monitored and assessed each student's progress. Each child's achievement is then reported to parents via the written report and the parent teacher meeting. These meetings will be held in the last week of term when teachers will go through the student's mid-year report.

### **Education State School Leadership Conference**

The state-wide conference is being held from the 7th June and 8<sup>th</sup> June. I will be attending the conference with other principals from Victoria.

#### **Reporting Day**

On Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> June we will be having our Parent /Teacher/Student meetings. More information will be sent home in the following weeks. It is important that parents or guardians attend these meetings with their child. The meetings provide an opportunity to raise any concerns parents or guardians have and for the teacher to discuss children's progress during the first semester. Students' first semester reports will be sent via Compass and will be discussed at this meeting.

#### **Foundation Enrolments 2022**

Enrolments are now being accepted for 2022. Families, who have a child starting Preps next year and have not yet enrolled them at Bethal, should contact the school office to arrange the enrollment as soon as possible as we are starting to plan our prep grades and to allocate teachers. Children who turn 5 before the 30<sup>th</sup> April, 2022 will be eliqible to start primary school.

#### **NAPLAN**

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy tests for all Year 3 and Year 5 students was held last week. Well done to all the year 3 and year 5 students. The results of these tests will become available later in the year and parents will receive their child's individual report. The report will describe the child's skills in reading, writing, language conventions and numeracy. It will also show how the child performed in relation to national benchmark standards. Results will then be used to see the improvement in student achievement at the school. We have put many programs in place to improve student learning and our programs are differentiated to meet the needs of all our students.

#### **PUNCTUALITY**

There are a large number of students who are being picked up early from school. This is disruptive to students' learning. Please ensure all children are at school by 8.55am and not being picked up before 3.30pm. All students must attend the full day unless they have an appointment.

# The Compass School Manager App


You can use the Compass app to action tasks. The app is available to download for free from the Apple App Store or the Google Play store.

Once installed and opened for the first time, you will be prompted to choose which school your child attends.

After selecting the school, you will be required to enter your login details which are the same details you use to login to your Compass parent portal.


When logged in, you will see -

- Each of your children who attend the school. You can click their image to go to their profiles.
- The option to add an attendance note
- Any items requiring your action (alerts) at the top of the screen.
- The newsfeed which you can scroll down through to read.
- A link to the main menu (three little stripes in top left corner



# The Home Page

When logged in, you will be on the Home page. Here you will see different sections of key information.



**Alerts -** These are clickable notifications of items that require your action.

**Newsfeed -** These are posts made by the school to communicate school information to you. You can scroll through any available posts and they will remain accessible for as long as the school has determined. They will generally display with the most recently dated post at the top however, posts set as 'Priority' by the school will show first regardless of the date.

**Child Information -** You will see each child you have at the school listed and clickable items that give you further details i.e clicking 'View Academic Reports' will take you to your child's available reports

**Menu options -** Across the top of the screen you will see a series of icons that open up menus for additional information you may require to access from time to time i.e. access to placing a canteen order, access to viewing upcoming event information etc.



# **Emotionally Intelligent Parenting**

#### Improving understanding while reading

Talk about the book during reading activities. This includes times when you read to your child and times when they are reading to you.

<u>Before</u> you start look at the cover and talk about the pictures and title. If there is a blurb on the back cover read the blurb together. Discuss the words in the title and the blurb and go over the meaning of any unfamiliar words. Practice using the se words in sentences together.

While you read discus what is happening and predict what might happen next. If prediction is challenging for your child give them choices.

Eg.

Do you think grandma will be home when Little red Riding Hood gets there?

Will she be at home, or do you think she might be out shopping?

Talk about what is happening and ask questions to get your child thinking about the text.

The simplest type of question is recognition and recall questions. Ask specific questions about information that was provided in the story.

Eg.

"Who was going to visit grandmother?"

"What was the little girl's name?"

"Where was she going?"

Talk about the vocabulary you have practised before starting and add new vocabulary to discuss as you read.

Be careful not to distract too much from the flow of the story

#### After reading ask more questions

Depending on your child's understanding level it might still be recognition and recall questions or it might move on to harder questions like inference and prediction.

More complex questions ask about what is not explicitly mentioned in the book.

Why do you think grandma had big teeth? (not to eat you with, but because she is really the wolf)


What do you think might happen?

Encourage your child to turn the pages back in the book to find the information.

Ask your child what they liked or didn't like about the book (appreciation questions)

Get your child to summarise what the story was about. Continue to practice using the new vocabulary.
