### Principal's Message



Dear Families,

I hope everyone had a wonderful break and are well rested for a fantastic finish to the year. Term Four will see our Grade Sixes visiting their new high schools while at the other end of the school, our 2023 Preps will be beginning their transition. I'm looking forward to a very busy and exciting term ahead.

#### CURRICULUM DAY & MELBOURNE CUP PUBLIC HOLIDAY — Oct 31 and Nov 1

Students will not be attending school on Monday October 31 (as we have a curriculum day) and Tuesday the 1st of November (Melbourne Cup Day Public Holiday).

<u>Hats in Term Four:</u> A reminder that term four is a 'sun-smart term', meaning that we all need to be wearing our hats when outside during recess and lunchtime. If you need to purchase a new hat for term four, please see our office staff who are here to help.

Planning for 2023: The Leadership Team are currently planning for 2023. We are looking at the number of students enrolled and considering our structure and the number of classes we will need to best support the learning programs that are provided for students. This planning considers the budget that will be available for staffing. This budget is determined by student numbers; therefore, it is important to have the best possible information when we are making our decisions. If you have a child who will be commencing in Prep next year, could you please submit your enrolment form as soon as possible? If you have a neighbour or friend who is intending to send their child to Bethal and has not yet enrolled, could you please encourage them to send along their paperwork. Conversely, any parents who know their children will not be continuing at Bethal, could you please let me know via email at David.Warren@education.vic.gov.au as soon as possible (or let our ladies in the office know). Even if you are not sure at this moment, a note about the possibility that this may occur is always helpful. As enrolment numbers affect our staffing decisions and the number of classes we have, it is important that we can predict as closely as possible what our expected enrolment will be in 2023.

Attendance: Every day counts when it comes to school attendance and going to school is the single most important part of your child's education! Research shows that each day missed is linked to progressively lower results in Reading, Writing and Mathematics. Time away from school creates gaps in learning and can also cause disconnects in friendships. There are always times when students need to miss school, such as when they are ill. It is vital however that where possible, attempts are made to reduce absent days and holidays are planned during school breaks where possible. At Bethal PS, we want to encourage all our students to love coming to school and to value their time spent learning in class with their teacher and peers!

The Grade 5/6s had a great time with an incursion this week to kick start their Inquiry topic on the economy. Students tested their business skills and mastered the market





# SCHOOL-WIDE POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT (SWPBS) @ BETHAL PRIMARY SCHOOL

The purpose of School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) at Bethal Primary School is to improve student outcomes through a safe and inclusive learning environment.

Our expectations are **Collaboration**, **Perseverance** and **Respect** and visibly displayed and represented around our school through our characters:







The school expectations underpin the SWPBS framework across the school. The expectations guide the language used for clarifying, teaching and acknowledging expected positive behaviours, as well as providing a rationale for responding to inappropriate behaviours.

#### **SWPBS Features:**

- As with all learning, behaviour must be taught, modelled and reinforced.
- Our Positive Behaviour Expectations matrix is explicitly taught to every classroom in every location at BPS.
- Students' individual needs and abilities are catered for.
- Staff have a common understanding of what the expected behaviours look like.
- All staff take responsibility for implementing consistent behaviour management strategies using a common language.
- Behaviour management data is used to guide further teaching and planning.
- Positive rewards and acknowledgments are offered to reinforce school expectations and behaviours.
- Staff actively pre-correct and teach expected behaviours.
- Logical consequences are applied if a student is not demonstrating the expected behaviours.
- Teachers implement appropriate prevention strategies to address potential behavioural challenges before they occur

#### **Positive Behaviour Expectations Matrix:**

Our Positive Behaviour Expectations matrix communicates Bethal PS' expectations for positive behaviours and learning across different settings of the school: ALL SETTINGS, LEARNING SPACES, OUTDOORS, TOILETS, CANTEEN and MOVING AROUND THE SCHOOL.

Through teaching, modelling, and reinforcing of the expected positive behaviours help teachers, principals, aides, and parents consistently reinforce a set of key behavioural and learning expectations during students' daily routines. As they are visibly displayed in the classroom and other settings, they help to increase students' understanding of Bethal PS' school-wide expectations and offer specific examples of actions students can take to meet these expectations.


